



WHISTLING GARDENS & DUNDURN CASTLE



Our day begins with a guided tour of the Dundurin Castle. A costumed interpreter will guide you through this early 19th century home, complete with period furniture and décor. This 40-room Italian style villa was built in the 1830's on Burlington Heights. Once home to Sir Allan Napier MacNab and his family, today Dundurn Castle tells the story of the family who lived above stairs and the servants who lived and worked below stairs to support their affluent lifestyle. Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Cornwall is the museum's Patron and the great, great, great granddaughter of Sir Allan MacNab. Enjoy a delicious lunch at the Olde School House, where her Majesty the Queen dined on one of her visits to Canada. Our next stop is at Canada's only privately run botanical gardens, Whistling Gardens. It's home to the largest public collection of conifers in the world with over 2,500 species, hybrids and cultivars on site. One of the many highlights at Whistling Gardens is the "fountain amphitheatre". The fountain display features over 100 individual fountains that have been choreographed to music composed by owner Darren Heimbecker.


