LONDON AND PARIS TOUR
TENTATIVE DAY TO DAY ITINERARY
May 27th – June 06th 2026

Day 1: Toronto

We are picked up at our homes today and whisked off to Pearson airport for our direct non-stop flight to London Heathrow.

Day 2: London

Welcome to London!

Upon your arrival into London Heathrow Airport, you will be met by your Blue Badge guide and Coach Driver. Travel into London with a Panoramic sightseeing tour of London, including some iconic London sights - Big Ben, Tower of London, V & A museum, Harrods, Albert Hall and more. You will enjoy a stop at Buckingham Palace, with a walk through St. James Park and a stop for lunch (lunch cost not included). We will arrive at your hotel around 3pm for check in and a leisurely evening on your own.

HOTEL: President Hotel (or similar) Includes full English daily breakfast.

Day 3: London

Today the group will be transferred to the Tower of London. Visit one of the most iconic and mysterious places in British history. This imposing castle, located on the banks of the River Thames, has served as a royal palace, prison, mint, and stage for political intrigues for over 900 years.

After the Tower of London, enjoy a river cruise on the Thames, dropping you off at The London Eye. Enjoy the 30 minute view of the sky, originally the Millennium Wheel, is a cantilevered observation wheel on the South Bank of the River Thames in London. It is the world's tallest cantilevered observation wheel.

Transfer back to the hotel.

This evening we make our way to the Gielgud Theatre for the theatre production of Oliver!

Oliver! is the jewel in the crown of British musicals, following a plucky young orphan as he dodges deception, abduction, and mistreatment in his quest for a better life—and a new gang of friends. With Dickens' classic tale as its backbone, this toe-tapping adaptation boasts iconic songs like 'Consider Yourself,' 'Food Glorious Food,' and the tear-jerking 'As Long As He Needs Me.' Originally hitting Broadway in 1963, Oliver!

Return to the hotel for the evening.

LONDON VISITOR OYSTER CARD

Day 5: London

STONEHENGE AND FULL AFTERNOON IN BATH - Private tour

With Entry to Stonehenge and Roman Baths Museum included

Pick up: 8:00am at President Hotel Return: 7:30 pm approx.

Stonehenge

The most famous prehistoric monument in the world, and now a world heritage site, Stonehenge stands alone in the vast empty tract of Salisbury plain. Its origins date back nearly 5,000 years and it has been home to pagan religion and spiritual worship, not to mention public debate ever since. What was this vast collection of stones intended for? Was it an observatory of the moon, a temple to the sun, or an elaborate cemetery? Who were the people who carried and carved these 40 ton rocks? Come and unlock the secrets for yourself and marvel at this remarkable and mysterious feat of ancient engineering and design.

Bath

Next we head to Bath and arrive in time for lunch. With fabulous restaurants, tea houses, sandwich and coffee shops, not to mention all the classic British pubs, you will be spoilt for choice of places to eat. Bath is a beautiful Georgian city with delightful crescents, terraces and architecture. Following our scenic drive into the heart of the city, there will be plenty of time to explore at your leisure. You could visit the Roman Baths that were built nearly 2,000 years ago or see Bath Abbey and Pulteney Bridge overlooking the river Avon cascading over the weir. Then there is the Jane Austen Centre and the elegant Assembly Rooms built in 1771. And you can shop, explore and take afternoon tea in the Pump Rooms while listening to the live classical music. With so much to see and do you will be glad that you have so much free time.

Roman Baths Museum - The Roman Baths were built nearly 2,000 years ago. Built on Britain's only natural hot water spring lies the magnificent Roman public bath complex and Roman temple. At the heart of the World Heritage Site you can walk around the steaming pool on the Roman stone paving and admire the ancient Roman statues and architecture.

Jane Austen Centre - Jane Austen, the English novelist responsible for *Pride and Prejudice*, is one of Bath's best known former residents. The Jane Austen Centre is a permanent exhibition in an original Georgian Townhouse. Visitors to the Centre are met by costumed 'character' guides, all eager to share their knowledge and take you back to Georgian Bath at the start of the 19th Century.

Arrive back in London at approximately at 19.30pm.

Day 8: Paris

This morning meet our local English speaking guide at the hotel and enjoy a 3 hour panoramic tour of Paris. During the day you will visit the Louvre Museum, the national art museum in Paris, France, and the most visited museum in the world. It is located on the Right Bank of the Seine in the city's 1st arrondissement and home to some of the most canonical works of Western art, including the Mona Lisa, Venus de Milo, and Winged Victory.

The next stop is Notre-Dame for a self-guided tour of this magnificent cathedral. Notre-Dame de Paris, often referred to simply as Notre-Dame, is a medieval Catholic cathedral on the Île de la Cité, in the 4th arrondissement of Paris, France. It is the cathedral church of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Paris. Transfer back to the hotel for the evening.

HOTELS:

LONDON | President Hotel | London

Overlooking a tree-lined square in Bloomsbury, this traditional hotel is a 2-minute walk from Russell Square tube station and a 5-minute walk from the British Museum. The relaxed rooms have free Wi-Fi, flat-screen TVs, and tea and coffee making facilities. Some offer Russell Square views. Rooms service is available. There are 5 dining options, including a carvery, a coffee shop, and an art deco-style bar serving afternoon tea and featuring a weekend jazz pianist.

PARIS | Best Western Hôtel Au Trocadéro | Paris

Set on a leafy street in the 16th arr., this simple hotel is a minute's walk from Trocadéro metro station, a 14-minute walk from the Eiffel Tower and 2 km from the Arc de Triomphe.

The straightforward rooms feature bright decor, as well as free Wi-Fi, flat-screen TVs, minibars, and tea and coffeemakers.

A breakfast buffet is offered (kids age 11 and under eat at no charge). There's also a relaxed lounge/bar, a business center and outdoor seating.

LONDON:

Top Attractions include Buckingham Palace – Witness the iconic Changing of the Guard and explore the grandeur of the royal residence.

Tower of London – Discover centuries of history and see the Crown Jewels.

Big Ben & Houses of Parliament – Marvel at the Gothic architecture and hear the famous chimes.

The British Museum – Explore artifacts from around the world, including the Rosetta Stone.

London Eye – Enjoy breathtaking views of the city from this giant Ferris wheel.

PARIS:

Top Attractions include Eiffel Tower – The most famous symbol of Paris, offering breathtaking views from its summit. Louvre Museum – Home to the Mona Lisa and countless masterpieces spanning centuries.

Notre-Dame Cathedral – A stunning example of Gothic architecture, rich in history.
