CHURCHILL POLAR BEARS

November 12th – 17th 2026

Day to Day Itinerary

Day One: Your polar bear adventure begins! Today our limousine service transfers us out to Pearson airport for our non-stop flight to Winnipeg. Upon arrival in Winnipeg you'll be met by a representative and transferred to your overnight hotel, the Lakeview Signature Inn. Time permitting, we recommend you head over to Winnipeg's Manitoba Museum or to the Forks, one of the city's most popular gathering places and a great place to purchase souvenirs from local Canadian artisans. Meet Your Group and Guides. This evening at your Winnipeg hotel, meet your host and group of fellow polar bear enthusiasts for a Q&A session. On your trip you'll enjoy a small group experience (maximum of 22 guests) led throughout by dedicated and knowledgeable guide.

Suggested Winter Clothing Rental

To ensure you are comfortable in Churchill's cold temperatures, ask us about how you can book winter clothing rentals. Options include Canada Goose parkas and snow pants, plus Baffin snow boots. We highly recommend you do this early, as availability is limited!

Day Two: We transfer back to Winnipeg airport for our flight north into polar bear territory. As you fly over the tundra, there are plenty of spectacular views! The excitement begins as you travel from Winnipeg to the remote town of Churchill. Situated on the Hudson Bay, Churchill is one of the best places in the world to view polar bears in the wild. Upon arrival we'll enjoy a Churchill Town and Area Tour. On this interpretive bus tour, we'll drive past various points around Churchill. You'll have the chance to photograph places like the Polar Bear Holding Facility, historical Cape Merry, and an impressive Inuksuk. Our next stop will be the Polar Bears International House, a hub for scientists and researchers. As you tour the centre, hear from a PBI representative and learn about ongoing polar bear research in the region. Thereafter we'll visit the Parks Canada Centre museum where you can discover more about Churchill's intriguing history. Explore the interactive displays, wildlife dioramas and historical exhibits. Next we'll transfer to our hotel the Tundra Inn (or similar), our home for the next 3 nights. They have comfortable accommodation, and great location in the heart of Churchill, this is the perfect place to relax before or after our arctic adventure. Your stay includes continental breakfast, free tea and coffee and high-speed internet. **(L.D.)**



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Day Three: The moment has finally come! After a hotel pick up, board a Tundra Buggy and start your search for polar bears! On our Tundra Buggy Adventure journey takes us through the extensive trail network of the Churchill Wildlife Management Area in search of polar bears. Since the number of visitors to the CWMA is highly restricted, your chances of seeing bears up close are excellent. This is prime polar bear habitat! Your knowledgeable guide will provide insights along the way.

About The Tundra Buggy Experience

You'll travel throughout the Churchill Wildlife Management Area onboard a large, specialized Tundra Buggy vehicle. Designed specially to maneuver across the rugged, snowy tundra, you will travel in comfort and stay safely out of reach of even the tallest polar bear when on the outdoor platform.

While a Tundra Buggy can hold up to 40 passengers, your smaller group size means you'll enjoy plenty of room. An onboard heater will keep you toasty throughout the day and a hearty picnic lunch will be served onboard.

After our Tundra Buggy Experience we'll have a cultural presentation, and learn what it's like to live in the northern reaches of Canada through firsthand stories from a Churchill resident, such as a local trapper. **(B.L.D.)**

Day Four:

We're off again on our Tundra Buggy. Enjoy another exciting day out on the Tundra searching for polar bears. As well as capturing incredible, up-close photographs of polar bears, you may see other types of wildlife such as arctic fox, ptarmigan, and snowy owl. After our Tundra Buggy Experience we'll return to our hotel. **(B.L.D.)**

Day Five: Today we're going dogsledding in Churchill! Enjoy this unique experience "the northern way of getting around"!

Dogsledding Adventure

Get ready for an authentic dogsledding experience as you meet a local Métis musher. Hear the incredible tales of Arctic racing, meet the pack of lovingly cared for sled dogs, then feel the exhilaration of racing a team through the boreal forest on a 1.6-kilometre (1-mile) -long groomed trail.



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After our “sledding adventure” we’ll visit the Itsanitaq Inuit Museum. Here we’ll learn more about Inuit culture. The museum's collection of Inuit carvings and artifacts are among the finest and oldest in the world, dating from Pre-Dorset (1700 B.C.) through Dorset, Thule and modern Inuit times. The museum is also a great place to find unique, locally crafted gifts and souvenirs. Alas it’s time to head back to Churchill airport for our flight back to Winnipeg; we’ll be carrying with us lifetime memories of a truly unique experience in the wilds of Northern Canada. We’ll overnight in Winnipeg before catching our flight back to Toronto. **(B.L.)**

Day 6: Today we transfer from our hotel back to Winnipeg airport where we board our flight back home to Toronto. Upon arrival in Toronto we’ll take our included limousine service back to our homes!
